Monday June 1st	<p>TP Basketball Provide two rolls of new Toilet Paper to your child. Place a bucket, small garbage can, or pail, a distance away from your child. Let them toss the TP to make a basket. Move targets to challenge .</p>	<p>Number Boxes On a larger piece of paper (or on the back of a cardboard box) grid out the numbers 1-20. Have your child place that number of items or stickers in the correct grid. Example</p>	<p>Paper Towel Hidden Messages Draw a picture or write some letters with markers onto a piece of paper towel. Place another piece of blank paper towel on top, and spray with water. Watch the design come through!</p>	<p>Scoop and Dump Write various letters on small rocks or items that your child can "scoop" up with a truck. Have them scoop and dump it at its correct dumping site (larger letters placed around the floor) Example</p>	<p>Mindful Monday Ways to calm down Breathing Strategies Feelings Video I can Solve Problems At Home</p>
Tuesday June 2nd	<p>SuperHero Run Tie a towel, Scarf, or adult shirt, around your child, to make a cape. Say "SuperHero" needed here. Have your child run to save you. Move around your yard to increase the distance.</p>	<p>Count Around the House Use the linked checklist, or create your own. Count to see how many of these things you can find around the house!</p>	<p>Small Object Hide & Seek Give your child a cup, bag, or bowl. Hide small objects such as buttons, paper clips, pieces of cereal, cotton balls, etc. Have your child walk around your home and place items in their container.</p>	<p>Newspaper Letter Hunt Sit with your child and look through the newspaper. Decide on a letter to find and watch your child find all the matches in the newspaper. Point them out or circle them in fun colors.</p>	<p>Talk about it Tuesday Decide on expectations to follow during the summer. Expectations for school and home</p>
Wednesday June 3rd	<p>Hit the Target Use hula hoops or chalk circles or rope to designate a target on the ground. Then have kids aim bean bags, balls, or soft toys and try to have them land in the target.</p>	<p>Memory Display 4 items or more, ask your child to look at them closely. Ask them to close their eyes and take an item away. When they open them can they tell you what is gone. Can use paper pieces with numbers, and shapes on items to use for the game. Could also just move them in different places and see if they can find out what is different.</p>	<p>Face Fun Draw a head and go around the house and outside and find things to decorate the face.</p> 	<p>Rhyme Bag Place lots of items (example spoon, socks, doll,book, ball, etc.) in a bag and have the child reach in and pull out an item. Come up with words that rhyme with it. Then continue the process.</p>	<p>Wacky Wednesday Create a calendar for June and make plans. Ideas for play</p>
Thursday June 4th Happy LAST Day of 4K	<p>Fun Outside In honor of the last day. We always celebrate outside. So go outside and play! Celebrate completing 4K!</p>	<p>Foot Length Cut a piece of string , or a paper strip the length of your foot. Walk around in the house and outside and see what is the same length of your foot, longer, and shorter.</p>	<p>Future you Draw a picture of you and what you want to be when you grow up. If you have a journal can be a journal entry. Chat about it.</p>	<p>Vacuuming the Alphabet Write the letters down on small pieces of paper. Sprinkle them all over the floor. The child will drive around and vacuum up the letter. Say the letter and/or sound before they vacuum up the letter.</p>	<p>Thoughtful Thursday Wishing you a great summer.
