



Dear Parents/Guardians and Students,

The start of the 2022-2023 school year is fast approaching. As summer draws to a close, I hope you have had ample time to rest and recuperate, to spend time with family and friends, and to reflect on your previous successes. Enclosed you will find important information about the upcoming school year.

At Rice Lake High School, we are always working to meet the needs of our students and parents. Communication and support from all stakeholders play important roles as we challenge students to reach their full potential. We have made the commitment to enhance accessibility to our learning activities and to allow parents access to these resources. All courses will be using Google Classroom again this year. Ask your son or daughter to show you the supports. To provide equitable access to digital materials, students will receive a district-issued Chromebook. They will be distributed on the first day of school, and it will be students' responsibility to keep them charged and protected throughout the year.

Freshman Orientation and High School Open House will both be held on the evening of **Tuesday, August 30th**. Freshman Orientation is an evening for freshmen and their parents to become acquainted with the building and procedures. Freshman Orientation will be held from **6:30 - 7:00 p.m.** in the HS auditorium. Open House is for all students and will be from **6:00 – 8:00 p.m.** Parents, please take advantage of this opportunity to meet your child's teachers and to see the great facilities that we are very proud of, thanks to community support.

Freshman First Day, which also includes new students to the district, will be **Thursday, September 1st**. This day allows incoming freshmen and transfer students the opportunity to get acquainted with their teachers and reduces the uneasiness of entering a new school. The first day of classes for sophomores through seniors will be **Friday, September 2nd**.

Over the past several years, staff have strived to become more consistent on grading practices and establish a culture that encourages students to embrace academic challenges. We will be revisiting these practices to ensure we are consistent. In addition to grading practices, staff have been working diligently to identify specific priority standards that students must meet. This will be an ongoing process as we move from a traditional percentage system to a standards-based reporting system. These standards will provide students and parents with a clear vision of what students must know and be able to do to succeed in their classes. Through our research, discussion, and trials, we have two practices connected to Grading for Learning that we have implemented: Retakes and Success Skills. The first practice is providing students the opportunity to retake assessments. Previously, many staff were offering retakes in some capacity, but we did not have a guiding document that would provide a consistent approach. I encourage you to review the enclosed document; it identifies our plan for retakes. Students will be reviewing this information with staff this fall.

A second crucial element is related to non-academic factors that we call Success Skills. As a staff, we have identified a list of skills that have an impact on academic success. These skills include being: Prompt &



Prepared, Persistent & Productive, and Responsible & Respectful. The goal is for students to self-assess their skill set according to the expectations for each category and for staff to use the rubric to help students improve. Self-assessment is a powerful tool to motivate individuals. Please review the attached rubric to familiarize yourself with the expected skills we want all students to develop. Employers share that these good habits are critical skills for all employees. In addition, as we work to prepare our students to be College and Career Ready, these characteristics are valuable indicators of future success.

As we begin a new school year, I want to stress the importance of attendance. It is critical, particularly on a block schedule, such as the one we have at RLHS, that students are present each and every hour of the school day. Research has shown that student attendance has a strong positive correlation to course performance. Students with good attendance also tend to be more engaged and feel more connected to their school. Therefore, I cannot stress enough the importance of being present in class. If an absence is unavoidable, please make sure your child is communicating with teachers and making up missing work in a timely fashion.

A continuous goal in the Rice Lake School District is to have schools that are safe, welcoming, and filled with kindness and compassion. Please never hesitate to contact me if you have information or concerns about our commitment to this ever-important goal.

I hope all of you are as excited to begin the school year as we are. We are anticipating many positive changes and opportunities. Please do not hesitate to call, email, or stop by if you have any questions or concerns.

Registration for the 2022-2023 School Year

Electronic communication will be vital for updates and staying connected for the 2022-2023 school year. Please be sure to follow the steps below and update your information accordingly.

Parents/Guardians are asked to **log into their online Skyward Family Access Account** ([click here to be linked to your Skyward log in](#)) and **complete the online “Back to School Forms/Fees” process**. The process includes the following:

- View back to school information
- Verify/update Student/Family/Emergency Information
 - Verify/update guardian email addresses
- Enter text message numbers that you want the school to use to contact you about school cancellations and other school communications (required to receive text messages)
- View/update information from the School Nurse for student health information and authorization for medical treatment and medication usage

- Menus and completing free/reduced lunch: [Food Service](#)
- Complete the field trip permission form
- And any other additional information that is relevant to your student

School Safety

Safety of our students continues to be a priority for our district. We will continue keeping our building secure during the school day through the use of a security camera and access system controlled by our office staff at the S1 visitor's entrance. Counseling services are provided for all students by the Student Services Department. Counseling is a process to help students in dealing with problems and making decisions. Counselors assist students with high school academic programs, post-high school planning, and personal concerns. Various department functions include group and individual counseling, group achievement testing and interpretation of test results, career investigation activities to help students with career planning, and scheduling assistance for students as they choose their high school courses.

Parking

Parking is on a first come, first service basis. If your student plans to utilize the parking lots at the Rice Lake High School, please go to your Family Access account to register your vehicle information. Parking in the student lot is a privilege. Students with outstanding detentions, fines or behavior referrals can lose parking privileges.

Change of Address/ Phone/etc.

When you have changes in demographic information (address, phone number, text numbers, emergency contacts, etc.) throughout the school year—please be sure to log into your Family Access account and make those changes.

Expectations of your Chromebook

This year each student will be issued a Chromebook to access content for their courses. The care and maintenance of this device is the responsibility of each student and their families. Accidental damage protection is optional and information is available on-line under Parent Resources and can be purchased through E –Funds.

Attendance

Parents, we need your help, understanding, and cooperation in promoting good attendance habits. Attendance is a major predictor of academic success, and every period of absence is a lost learning opportunity. This requires regular attendance! Did you know that missing even one day of school every two weeks can negatively affect student grades? Research on student achievement shows that maintaining a 97% attendance rate is important in maximizing academic success. That calculates to missing fewer than five days of school throughout the year. Please stress consistent daily attendance at home and help your child aim to meet the 97% attendance rate!

Absences

Please call the school before 8:00 a.m. on the day of an absence to report your son or daughter absent due to illness. If a telephone call is not received by 2:00 pm the day of the absence, a note indicating the reason for the absence will be required the day he/she returns to school. Students will be marked unexcused and disciplinary action taken if there is no note or phone call received within 24 hours of the absence. Any other absence must be pre-excused prior to the absence per state law. This can be done by bringing a note to the Attendance Office. **Regular attendance is extremely important and is expected.** Please contact Tonia Leamy at 715-234-2181 ext. 5641 or at leamyt@ricelake.k12.wi.us with any questions.

Cellphone Usage

Student cell phones are not permitted in the classroom. Cell phones must be stored in lockers or backpacks during the school day (bell to bell) with the following exceptions:

1. In hallways during passing time. (Prohibited in locker rooms).
2. During lunch hour. (Prohibited in locker rooms).
3. Before and after school. (Prohibited in locker rooms).

Any student possessing a cell phone in a classroom will need to bring their phone to the office. The cell phone will be returned to the student or parent/guardian, depending on the number of offenses. Refusal to turn over a cell phone will result in disciplinary action.

Student Handbook

During the first week of school, each homeroom class will review the RLHS Student Handbook. The handbook contains information about discipline, attendance, and other policies, procedures, and regulations necessary for the smooth and safe operation of the high school.

Student Fees

Rice Lake has a few set fees that must be paid by each student. Some of these fees are listed below, while others may arise during the year, depending on the types of classes the student is taking. Please pay these fees by the first day of school:

A number of “check-points” have been established to assure that students do not accumulate a number of unpaid fines and fees over long periods of time. Students with unpaid fines or fees will not be allowed to participate in graduation. To check your student’s balance, visit your Skyward Family Access and select Fee Management.

Supplemental Student Insurance

Students and their parents/guardians are responsible for providing accident insurance for the student. The school assumes no financial liability in connection with any accident at any time. Although many families have adequate health and accident insurance, there are some families whose coverage is not adequate or who have no insurance. A low cost group insurance plan is being offered through the First Agency Insurance Company for those who feel they do not have adequate coverage or wish to have additional protection.
