Loans from a Bank	Students can apply for student loans through their bank with parents co-signing.
OSAP - link in application www.osap.on.ca	<p>OSAP applications can be completed at any time and are independent of the school as there is confidential information required.</p> <p>OSAP grants/loans are established once a student has a firm acceptance to a College or University.</p>
Bursaries	Monetary awards based upon academic record and/or financial need
Scholarships including Admission Scholarships	Awards are based on many different/combinations of factors (academic, financial, community involvement, leadership etc.)
